Meet the Facilitators: The Reverend Dr. James (Jim) R. Newby is the Senior Minister of The Church of the Savior in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, and the Director of the Trueblood Yokefellow Academy. Before coming to Oklahoma, Jim was the Minister of Faith and Learning at the Wayzata Community United Church of Christ in Wayzata, Minnesota, and the Minister of Spiritual Growth at Plymouth Church in Des Moines, Iowa.



He has served as the Director of the Yokefellow Institute at Earlham College in Richmond, Indiana, and was on the faculty of the Earlham School of Religion. Jim holds degrees from Princeton Theological Seminary, Earlham School of Religion, and Friends University, and has served in pastorates and denominational leadership positions in North Carolina, Ohio and Nebraska. He is, by tradition, a Quaker, and the author of *Sacred Chaos: One Man's Spiritual Journey Through Pain and Loss*.



Dr. Mark Minear earned his PH.D in Counseling Psychology from Ball State University in 1997. He returned to graduate school after 20 years in the pastoral ministry. Besides Ball State, he holds degrees from the Earlham School of Religion and William Penn University. He is currently a licensed psychologist in the State of Iowa and practices full-time, providing psychotherapy, assessment, consultation and training. Mark utilizes a multidimen-

sional model of wellness in his therapeutic approach; this allows for his clients to work across physical, emotional, intellectual, vocational, social, environmental and spiritual domains. He is the Director of Mental Health Services at the Iowa Veterans Home in Marshalltown, Iowa, and lives with his family in Marshalltown.
